

Victorian Weirdness

The Victorian Era was a peculiar time to live in. The social-political backdrop and the life and reign of Queen Victoria had a major impact on the art and architecture of this period. The Industrial Revolution required architects to rethink their designs and adapt them to the needs of the people who were finding it difficult to survive. The life of Victorian society was

often filled with rapidly changing morals, resulting in some curious, weird, and creepy oddities. This twopart lecture will give us a look at the art and architectural movements of the time, including the Gothic Revival period, the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood, and the Arts and Crafts movement, as well as some of the more peculiar designs of the period, such as hair sculptures and poisonous wallpaper.

City Girls in the Central Sierra: Fresno Y.W.C.A. Summer Camps

In the 1920s, the Fresno YWCA opened the first local camp for young urban women. Over the next 60 years, they built three camps for thousands of Valley women at Shaver Lake, Huntington Lake, and Dinkey Creek. The camps made an indelible mark on the Central Sierra community, as well as changing the lives of three generations of young women. Join historian Micheline Golden to

hear about the camps, the dedicated women who built them, and how the young women of the Central Valley embraced outdoor learning in the Sierra Nevada.

- Please do not be intimidated. You can learn anything!
- From your desktop or laptop computer, phone or tablet:
 - Apple device (iPhone, iPad): Download Zoom from the Apple App Store.
 - Android device (phone or tablet that's not an Apple product): Download Zoom from the Google Play Store.
 - Open the app or go to **www.zoom.us** and follow the instructions on screen.
- To participate in live video, Zoom will use the camera on your device (phone, laptop, tablet) if it has one. If you do not have a camera on your device, you can listen in by phone but others won't be able to see you.
- NOTE: You do not need to upgrade or pay for your account to participate in OLLI Zoom events. Our license is through the university and allows you to participate fully. If you decide to host your own Zoom meetings with family, friends or interest groups, you may wish to upgrade someday - but there is no need to for OLLI.
- If you cannot log in to a video platform, you can listen to classes via telephone. The phone number to dial in to will be provided once you register.
