

POLICY ON THE USE OF UNIVERSITY BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

On January 24, 1982, a Presidents' Directive was issued regarding the "Use of University Buildings and Grounds". Included in the directive were provisions which prohibit:

1. the conduct of commercial transactions on campus, except under special circumstances when such activity has been authorized in advance by the Vice President for Administration and University Relations;
2. commercial solicitation (including the selling of published materials) on campus without the express and prior approval of the Student Programs Office; and
3. advertising and the distribution of handbills and circulars on campus, without express permission from the Student Programs Office.

The President's Directive should serve as a guide to anyone who has questions regarding selling, advertising, or the conduct of any other form of commercial activity on campus. A copy of the Directive may be obtained from the following offices:
