Graduate Online Pedagogy and Mentorship Workshop

August 10-14 & 20, 2015

Invitation

The Graduate Net Initiative and CSALT/TILT invite you to participate in the Summer 2015 Graduate Online Pedagogy and Mentorship Workshop. Faculty currently teaching or planning to teach postbaccalaureate/graduate courses online are strongly encouraged to participate.

Offered in hybrid form, the week-long workshop will offer graduate faculty the opportunity to consider, discuss, and implement best practices proven effective in graduate-level online pedagogy and mentorship. Topics to be covered include, but are not limited to:

- Student and faculty perceptions of online graduate education;
- Comparative considerations of undergraduate vs. graduate online course development;
- Pedagogy, andragogy, and heutagogy;
- Course development, digital tools, and their deployment;
- Factors affecting online student success at the graduate level;
- Student support and mentorship in the online graduate environment.

Upon completion of the Workshop, participants will receive a \$2000 stipend funded by the Graduate Net Initiative, a U.S. Department of Education Promoting Postbaccalaureate Opportunities to Hispanic Americans (PPOHA) grant project. The Initiative seeks to serve the campus and community by expanding access to our postbaccalaureate academic programs and support services. Our mission is to harness technology to realize equity of access and of outcomes for Hispanic and other under-represented students while bolstering the ability of all our graduate students to succeed academically and professionally. A core aspect of this mission is to support and expand online graduate programs and bolster faculty-student relationships through the delivery of cutting-edge faculty training on digital graduate pedagogy and mentorship.

Program Requirements

- Completion of a pre-workshop survey assessing needs;
- Attendance and participation in all face-to-face interactions;
- Enrollment and participation in an online course on Blackboard;
- Attendance and participation in the Online Graduate Pedagogy roundtable at the 2015 TILT Conference on August 20;
- Completion of a post-workshop survey assessing the workshop and the various topics covered.
