

# Fresno State Amputee Clinic- GAME Lab

Doctorate program of Physical Therapy (DPT) is engaging faculty, DPT students, and community healthcare providers in a pro-bono clinic for local community members who have limb amputations. The Amputee Clinic was founded by Dr. Bhupinder Singh in 2014.



Fresno State Amputee Clinic is a pro bono clinic dedicated to serving the amputee community of Central Valley.

## Education and Interventions

The clinic brings together local clinicians, faculty and students in the doctor of physical therapy program who work together to provide preventative care and manage any current conditions afflicting these individuals. Amputees can receive consultations from physical therapists, physicians, nurses, podiatrists, vascular specialists, and local prosthetists.

## Interdisciplinary Collaboration

The clinic has created multiple opportunities in collaborating with other colleges and departments on campus, and through involvement with off campus clinicians and services.

## Opportunities for Research

Members of the clinic have the opportunity to participate in research led by Dr. Bhupinder Singh and Dr. Jennifer Roos. The research aims at analyzing and improving amputee gait, strength, mobility and overall quality of life.
