Methodology

A mixed methods concurrent triangulation strategy was utilized to obtain both quantitative and qualitative data concurrently.

Participants

- Fresno State students with a declared primary major under the College of Arts and Humanities

Stakeholders

- Academic Counselors within the College of Arts and Humanities (CAH)

Design

- The researchers developed a 21 item survey using Qualtrics and disseminated the survey via email utilizing GradesFirst to 2,221 students who have declared a major under the Fresno State College of Arts and Humanities.
- The researchers conducted a structured focus group with a purposeful sample of CAH juniors.



Recommendations

1. Student lens on design and location of advising centers
2. Increased signage & visibility to promote services and location
3. Maintain flexible & expanded advising hours
4. Consider more frequent mandatory advising sessions
5. Provide professional development training
6. Develop an assessment plan

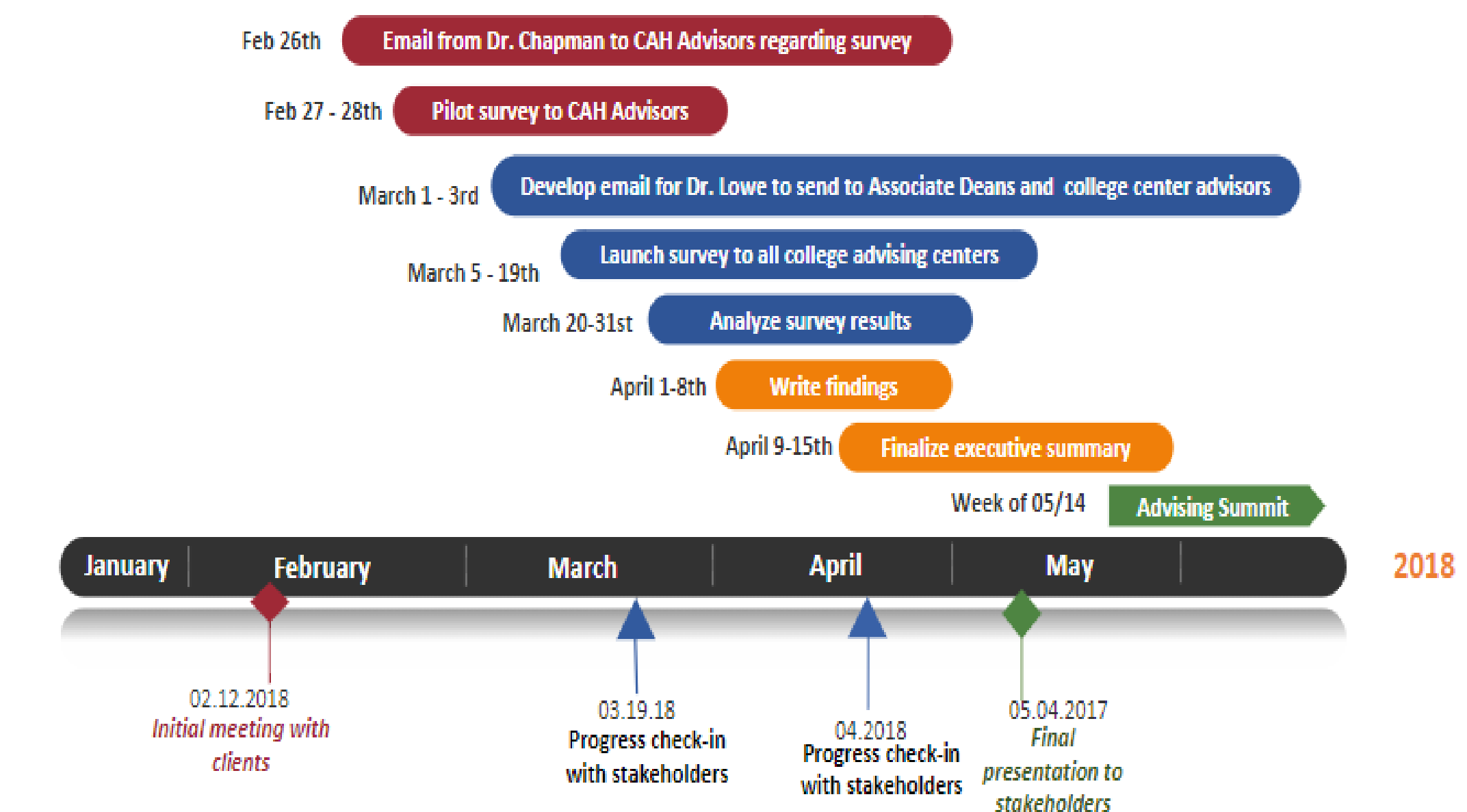
Purpose and Scope of Evaluation
