- Week-long program connects students with professional artists in the field of children's literature.
- Artist collaborates with professors to integrate applicable curriculum.
- Fellowship program provides a more personal level of learning engagement and promotes the relevancy of literature for young people.
- Artist interacts with the wider community, delivering presentations to public school students and community based organizations.
- Award recipients of the fellowship receive a \$10,000 stipend plus paid travel expenses

Research Fellowship Program

- Two Fellowships of up to \$2,000 are awarded annually to scholars outside the Fresno/Clovis area.
- Funds support transportation and living expenses for conducting on-site research.
- Selection based on significance to the study of children's literature, likelihood of publication or other dissemination of the work, and relevance of the project to the Center's holdings.
- Publication of findings promote the study of children's literature and increase recognition of the Center and Fresno State.
- Fellowships encourage innovative and robust inquiry into the varied aspects of children's literature.
