Executive Order 1095 Reported Incidents: Fiscal Year 2017-2018

Execuv e Order 1095 requires California State Universies to publish reports on incidents annually on October 1st, for the prior fiscal year (July 1 to June 30), without disclosing any informaon that would reveal the idenes of the pares in volved. This report a empts to summarize the acvity occurring in response to reports of Sexual Misconduct, Dang and Domesc Violence, and Stalking, received by the Title IX Office at Fresno State during the 2017-2018 fiscal year.

It remains an uncommon occurrence for a student to report directly to the Title IX Coordinator. Most reports, understandably, start with someone who is more closely connected to the student. The most common type of report was received from a third party, typically someone affiliated with the University with whom a campus member shared they had been the vicm of either Sexual Harassment, Sexual Misconduct, Dang or Domes c Violence, or St alking. The third party in turn made a report to the Title IX office, sharing the informaon r eceived.

The Title IX Coordinator and/or Deputy Coordinator responded to every report that was received. When such a report is received, our first task is to ensure that the community member is aware of the resources available, both on and off campus, and the various opons the y have for securing accommodaons and/ or pursuing the ma er in various forums (criminal, civil, administrav e). This includes inving the community member to meet and further explore what, if anything, they feel ready to do. Not captured in this report are the numerous outreach and training acvies offered through the Title IX Coordinator and campus partners.

The report focuses exclusively on the campus response to reports of specific instances of potenal Title IX viola ons, and does not include r eports of sexual harassment or other discriminaon based on se x or gender. Clery stas cs in the Univ ersity's Annual Security and Fire Safety Report are reported for the 2017 calendar year as required by federal law. Reports to the Title IX Coordinator may be related to incidents which did not take place on Clery defined geography, therefore the stas cs in this r eport may not coincide with Clery stas cs in the Annual Security Report.
