Position Summary:

Under the direction of the Assistant Athletics Director of Sports Medicine and Staff Athletic Trainers, the Athletic Trainer Graduate Intern will be given an opportunity to learn about the administration of a team and other aspects related to athletic training and sports medicine. This program hopes to prepare young professionals for a rewarding and successful career in Sports Medicine. Upon completion of the program, we hope to have enhanced and furthered a young professional's communication, administrative and clinical skills. Our goal, under the direction of the Assistant Director for Sports Medicine, is to prepare young athletics trainers to make a difference in Sports Medicine and to continue to represent the Fresno State program. Duties include but are not limited to:

- Prevention, management and rehabilitation of athletic injuries
- Clinical instruction and supervision of athletic training students in the ATEP Program
- Home and away coverage of assigned team
- Communication with coaches, athletics department personnel, parents, team physicians and other medical specialists
- Facilitation of medical referrals and physician visits
- Other administration duties as assigned
