

Giving Hope to Autistic Children

Autism is a poorly understood brain development disorder that affects one in 150 children. At Fresno State's Central California Autism Center, researchers use early intervention and the latest scientific findings to develop communication skills in autistic children.

Under center director Dr. Amanda Adams, children ages 18 months to 6 years receive one-on-one therapy before joining small groups and classroom settings. Many can then function in public schools, and some lose their diagnosis completely.
