REQUIREMENTS

Department of Viticulture and Enology

Minor in Viticulture

A Minor in Viticulture for a bachelor's degree requires 14 units of upper-division viticulture coursework and 10-16 units of preparative coursework.

Specific course requirements

General Viticulture (6 units)

VIT 101 and 102

Viticulture Electives (8 units)

A minimum of 8 upper-division viticulture elective units selected in consultation with a department advisor including:

- VIT 106 or both 103 and 105 (2-4 units)
- VIT 160 or 165 (2-3 units)
- Sufficient electives from the above course groups (or BIOL 161; VIT 162T, 190, 194I, or 199) to meet the 8-unit viticulture elective requirement.

These viticulture courses will require that students complete additional prerequisite coursework that may include the following: MEAG 3, BIOL 11, BIOL 161, and CHEM 3A or CHEM 1A, 1AL, 1B, and 1BL
