## Topic Course Descriptions Spring 2010 Concurrent Courses

- ART 109T Intermediate Glassblowing (3 units)**  
 Tuesdays and Thursdays: January 21 – May 11  
 Emphasis is on the further development of glass blowing skills and the discipline of working molten glass. Students will be working with molds, offhand techniques including decorating, applying bit work for creating functional, sculptural, and aesthetic designs in the glass media.
- ART 109T Advanced Glassblowing (3 units)**  
 Tuesdays and Thursdays: January 21 – May 11  
 Course will expand the skills from the intermediate level in glass. There will be emphasis on individual aesthetics, personal style and professional development. Working in series using advanced design and decorating techniques, students are required to display their personal style in art using glass as their medium.
- ART 109T Art Glass Methods (3 units)**  
 Mondays and Wednesdays: January 25 – May 10  
 An investigation into warm and cold glass working techniques such as kiln forming, slumping, fusing, casting, pate de verre and photo transfer.
- COUN 180T Career Choices for Today's Market (3 units)**  
 Tuesdays: January 26 – May 11  
 This 3-unit course is designed to provide participants with knowledge and understanding of the field of career counseling and development and the roles of career counselors. They will learn the skills needed to assist their clients/students to explore and pursue rewarding and meaningful career paths. Participants will appreciate the important role of career counseling in exploring new approaches to career decision-making.
- CRIM 270T Victimology (3 units)**  
 Online: January 21 – May 12  
 This introductory course will provide you with a basic overview of the theories, concepts and practices of victimology; measurement of victimization; vulnerability; culpability; victim blaming; types of victims; victim rights; victim services; the victim's role in the criminal justice system; victim compensation and restitution; and, mediation and restorative justice.
- CRIM 270T Family Violence (3 units)**  
 Online: February 1 – March 26  
 This is a fully online course that examines the typology and history of family abuse including: legal guidelines, treatment approaches, emotional abuse, sexual abuse, spousal abuse, elder abuse, and child abuse as a criminogenic factor. The objective of this course is to provide students with the tools to address an array of issues pertaining to family violence and the laws, policies, and programs that are in place to address this issue.
- CRIM 270T Legal Policy and Victim Services (3 units)**  
 Online: February 1 – March 26  
 This is a fully online course that examines specific issues relating to rights of victims of crime, with special emphasis on the development and growth of victim's rights in the legal system. This course requires students to use critical thinking skills in the analysis of legislation and specific legal policies regarding victim services. The objective of this course is to provide students with the tools to address an array of issues pertaining to victim rights, the process of changing attitudes, and current victim services, laws, policies, and programs.
- CRIM 270T Victim Services (3 units)**  
 Online: February 1 – March 5  
 This course surveys community services for victims. It will focus on victim services as a new subsystem—theoretical, social, and legal issues that affect delivery of victim services.
- HUM 101T Teaching About the Middle East (3 units)**  
 Online: March 5 – April 9  
 This course will offer a survey of the achievements of Middle Eastern civilizations, focusing especially on the revivalist Medieval explorations. The material shared in class and on Blackboard is developed specifically for elementary and middle school teachers by well known research institutes. At the completion of this course, teachers will be able to locate material, integrate, and evaluate a unit on Middle East into their curricula.
- RLS 192T Whitewater Rafting (1 unit)**  
 Wednesdays, Saturdays or Sundays: March 18 – April 18  
 Students in this course will learn the fundamental skills for traveling safely down America's streams and rivers. Discussions will include elements of safety, river class levels and conditions, rescues and rescue scenarios, where and when to go rafting in America, and river craft and the various options available. The course will culminate in a one-day whitewater rafting trip on the upper Kings River east of Fresno.
- RLS 192T Snorkeling and Try Scuba (1 unit)**  
 Thursdays: January 21 – February 25  
 Snorkeling and scuba diving are excellent recreational activities that you will enjoy for the rest of your life. This course will lead students through the proper knowledge of the sport of snorkeling, develop the skills needed to snorkel safely in appropriate conditions, discuss the proper equipment and give the experiences needed to be safe and comfortable snorkeling. The program will also include a Try Scuba experience.
