ABOUT SUMMER SESSION

Summer Session is a nine-week term that allows students to take Fresno State courses in a condensed format. Summer Session classes offer residence credit and can be used toward a degree program, just like any class in the fall or spring semester.

Who Can Attend?

Summer Session classes are open to current Fresno State students as well as the general public. Students do not need to be admitted to Fresno State to take a Summer Session class.

In order to take a Summer Session course, a student must:

- Be at least 18 years of age or have a high school diploma or equivalent
- Meet any prerequisites of the course they wish to take

A Fresno State student who has been previously disqualified, may still register for Summer Session courses as long as they meet any course prerequisites.

If a student expects to complete degree or credential requirements through Summer Session, they should confirm course applicability with their advisor. Registration in Summer Session does not construe admission to Fresno State, nor should it be interpreted as acceptance to any degree or credential program. REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Course Information

Course descriptions from the University Catalog are included in the Course Schedule beginning on page 4. Although the majority of courses are open for any qualified student, some courses are restricted and require permission from a department office or the instructor for enrollment. The Course Schedule will note courses with restrictions.

Registration

There is no priority registration in Summer Session. Any student may register at any time beginning on March 20.

Students should register early to ensure their places in classes, as each class has an enrollment limit. Early Registration is from March 20 through May 21, 2017. Early Registration fees must be paid by May 21, 2017. Students who do not pay fees will be dropped from their classes on May 22, 2017.

Late Registration begins on May 22, 2017. Starting on that date, students will need to register and pay fees within 24 hours. Students who fail to pay fees within 24 hours of registration will be dropped from their courses. Online registration for all courses is available up to and including the class start date. Registration will be allowed through the fourth calendar date after the class start date, but only with a permission number from instructor. Students may not register after the first day of class if the class is less than five days long.

Students may register online or in person at the Division of Continuing and Global Education. Current Fresno State students may register by logging into *my.fresnostate.edu*. New or non-matriculated students should visit *fresnostate.edu/cge/registration/howtoregister.html* for registration instructions.

Course Cancellations

Summer Session courses must meet minimum enrollment levels in order to launch. Courses that do not meet minimum enrollment levels will be cancelled. Enrollment between March 20 and May 29 determines which classes are launched and which are cancelled. Registration will freeze May 30 and 31. During those two days, Continuing and Global Education personnel will work with the course instructors to determine cancellation decisions.

If a course is cancelled, enrolled students will receive a full refund of their tuition and course fees. Students should NOT wait and see if the course is cancelled prior to enrolling.

Beginning June 1 through the first day of class, additional registrations will be accepted (space permitting) for classes that are slated to launch. During this time period, students will be required to pay registration fees within 24 hours of enrolling.

Tuition and Course Fees (see page 8 for fee charts)

The California State University system and Fresno State make every effort to keep student costs to a minimum. The California State University and Fresno State must reserve the right, even after initial payments are made, to increase or modify any listed fees, without notice; we also reserve the right to correct errors in marketing documents. All listed fees should be regarded as estimates that are subject to change.

For Undergraduate courses, the tuition-fee per unit is \$315. For Graduate courses, the tuition-fee per unit is \$386. The tuition fee for each individual course is listed in the Course Schedule.

Some courses have additional fees for lab materials or other required items. Additional course fees are listed in the Course Schedule.

By paying tuition and course fees, students will reserve seats in the classes.

How to Pay

Students may pay their Summer Session fees in one of three ways. Payments should be classified as "Payment – Continuing and Global."

- Online: Students may submit payments through their MyFresnoState accounts after registering for courses. They may pay with an "E-Pay" Electronic check or Fresno State Choice Card without incurring any service charges. Credit card payments are accepted with a Visa, MasterCard, American Express, or Discover card. A 2.75% service charge applies to online credit card payments. Students may also use an International Foreign Transfer (IFT). The IFT service charge depends on foreign currency rates.

The University is NOT responsible for delayed or lost mail. Payment must be made payable to California State University, Fresno. The following information needs to be included on the face of the check, cashier's check, or money order: student's first and last name, Fresno State ID number, and a description of the fee that is being paid.

- In person: cash, checks, cashier's checks, money orders, and VISA/MasterCard are accepted at the Cashiering Services windows in the south lobby of the Joyal Administration Building. Payment must be made payable to California State University, Fresno. If paying by VISA/MasterCard, the cardholder must present the credit card and proper identification (e.g. valid driver's license, passport, etc.).

Check Conversion Notice—Effective July 18, 2011

Providing a personal check as payment, you authorizes Accounting Services either to use information from the check to make a one-time electronic fund transfer from the account holder or to process the payment as a check transaction.

Financial Aid

Financial aid may be available for current Fresno State students who are enrolled in a minimum of six units during the summer. Those six units may be earned in May-June Intersession as well as Summer Session. Students who are interested in obtaining financial aid, should pick up a Summer Interest Form from the Financial Aid Office beginning April 4, 2017, and it must be submitted by June 15, 2017. Students may direct any questions to the Financial Aid office at 559.278.2182. The Financial Aid office is located at the north lobby windows in the Joyal Building.

Grading Options

Students may select their choice of grading option— Letter or CR/ NC (credit or no credit)— choosing only what is available for the class (choices will be limited to available options if you register online. Students who register in-person must verify available grading options with the department in advance). The designated grading option is what will be posted on students permanent transcripts. For classes lasting four or fewer days, changes in grading option—including changing to "audit"—must be made prior to the class start date. For all other classes, changes in grading option—including changing to "audit"—must be made no later than Friday of the first week of class.

Forms

The following forms can be found at www.fresnostate.edu/cge/forms

- Registration Form: Students may use this form to register in-person for a Summer Session course.
- Program Change/Refund Form: This form will allow students to drop a Summer Session course and/or request a refund of their fees.
- Administrative Change Form: This form can be used by instructors or department chairs to request that a student be withdrawn from courses. It can also be used to correct student enrollment for Summer Session courses. Students may use the form to audit a class or, with instructor approval, enroll in two classes that have overlapping meeting times.

Wait Lists

Wait lists are available for Summer Session. If a student is placed on a wait list, they should check their Fresno State email account regularly to find out if they have been moved from the wait list to the class roster. Beginning May 22, 2017, fees are due within 24 hours after a student is placed on the class roster. Students will be dropped for non-payment if fees are not paid within 24 hours of being placed on the roster.

Drops/Withdrawals/Refunds

Students who fail to attend class may receive a failing grade unless they formally drop the class. Classes may be dropped online at my.fresnostate.edu.

No drops are allowed after the fourth calendar day. Students who have a serious and compelling reason and who wish to drop on the fifth calendar day or later may petition to drop with a grade of "W." Pick up a Request for Record Adjustment in the Division of Continuing and Global Education or obtain the form online: <http://www.fresnostate.edu/studentaffairs/are/forms/index.html>. Submit the request to the Admissions, Records and Evaluations Office in the Joyal Building, Room 106.

Students may obtain a full refund if they drop their Summer Session class(es) before the first day of instruction. Partial refunds may be available after instruction begins, depending on the class:

- Students may obtain a partial (65%) refund on classes that meet for at least five days if they drop no later than the fourth calendar day of the class. The Program Change/Refund form may be used for drops after instruction has begun.
- Students will not be able to drop or obtain a refund on classes that meet for fewer than five sessions or five calendar days.

To request a refund, complete the Program Change/Refund Form (www.fresnostate.edu/cge/forms) and submit it to the Division of Continuing and Global Education. Students must submit the Program Change/Refund Form to obtain a refund if they drop a class themselves.

NOTE: If a class is cancelled by Continuing and Global Education, students will receive a refund automatically and will not have to turn in the Program Change/Refund Form.

Continuing and Global Education Hours

The Division is open Monday through Friday, 8:00 am - 5:00 pm; summer hours beginning May 22, 2017, are 7:00 am to 3:30 pm. The university is closed on May 29 in observance of Memorial Day. We are located in Kremen Education, Room 130 and we can be reached by calling 559.278.0333.

Topic Course Descriptions

CE 191T – Essential Tools in Water Resources Engineering (3 units)

This course is designed to enable students to learn engineering tools in the fields of civil and water resources engineering. Students will learn how to develop hydrologic and hydraulic models to analyze and design different hydraulic structures. The hydraulic structures include but not limited to levees, dams, channels, storm drains, culverts, and other flood control facilities. To develop the hydrologic and hydraulic models, students will be familiarized with different sources of geospatial, hydraulics, and hydrologic datasets. The software package that will be taught includes but not limited to HEC-1 and HEC-HMS, HEC-2 and HEC-RAS, HEC-SSP, and CulvertMaster. Hydrologic modeling software HEC-1 and HEC-HMS will be used for rainfall-runoff analysis. Hydraulic software HEC-2 and HEC-RAS will be used for river system analysis. HEC-SSP will be used for statistical analysis of time series data for flood frequency study and CulvertMaster will be used for the analysis of culvert hydraulics. To develop geo-referenced hydraulic model, ArcGIS software tool will be introduced and HEC-GeoRAS will be taught.

CFS 132T – Care of the Hospitalized Child: An Introduction to Child Life Services (3 units)

Introduction to the field of child life and role of the child life specialist in the hospital setting. Topics include impact of healthcare experiences on child development and family coping, therapeutic interventions to minimize trauma and support healing, grief and loss in childhood, relaxation strategies, therapeutic play, and advocacy for developmentally-appropriate care within the hospital. This course is taught by a Certified Child Life Specialist in accordance with the requirements of the Child Life Council for national certification.

COUN 180T – APA Writing (1 unit)

An interactive course designed to offer skills to improve APA style of writing. The course will cover elements of mechanics and style as recommended by APA Publication Manual, 6th Edition.

CSCI 191T – Information Security (3 units)

A thorough visit of information security, cryptography, operating system security, authentication, network security, denial of services, and intrusion detection. Prerequisite: CSCI 156 and CSCI 144 or permission of instructor.

EHD 180T – Pre-Internship Fieldwork (2 units)

Orientation to role of teacher in public schools; 45 observation hours of teacher-pupil interaction, instructional approaches, classroom management at the elementary and secondary level.

PSYCH 120T – Forensic Cognitive Science (4 units)

This course provides students with an understanding of the scientific basis of cognition, in practice and application, in police and forensic psychology, specifically in the psychology and cognitive neuroscience pertinent to tactical, investigative, and courtroom contexts. This course is intended to acquaint students with a comprehensive view of the psychological principles involved in such contexts, from the perspective of contemporary experimental psychology and neuroscience. The course will present and review the necessary principles and demonstrate their application to field situations. Material will be situated in current theory and in application to current and developing law enforcement contexts.

PSYCH 150T – Evolutionary Psychology (3 units)

Darwinian Theory has been one of the greatest influences on scientific thinking since its inception in the late nineteenth century. Evolutionary theory laid the foundation for the functionalist school of psychology, which later morphed into behaviorism. Starting in the mid-1980s there has been a resurgence of evolutionary thinking in Psychology. The course explores evolutionary theory from a psychological perspective. Many of the topics focus on adaptations forged by sexual selection including male and female mate preferences, mating intelligence, sexual jealousy, mate guarding, mate poaching, flirting, and romantic love. Other topics explored by this class from an evolutionary perspective include parenting, kin investment, altruism, religion, morality, and the arts. Finally, we will also explore how the adaptations shaped by the millions of years our species spent on the savannah plains of Africa fit into our modern world.

PSYCH 180T – Stereotyping, Prejudice, and Discrimination (4 units)

In this course, we will examine the cognitive and affective bases of social discrimination among humans. Topics include prejudice and discrimination, stereotypes, old-fashioned and contemporary forms of prejudice, individual differences and prejudice, the experience of discrimination, and reducing stereotyping, prejudice, and discrimination.

RA 192T – Environmental Interpretation for Practitioners (1 unit)

Outdoor recreation and natural resources provide a unique context for educating adults and children about environmental issues. This context provides a learning environment that is conducive to promoting environmental awareness and interpretation techniques. Practitioners will learn the methods, principles, and philosophies of Environmental Interpretation, with an emphasis being placed upon the natural resources specific to California's ecosystems. Using the environment as the vehicle, students will discover how to use specific topics, themes, and stories to capture the attention of their audience. The roles of environmental education and persuasive communication in promoting environmental attitudes and behaviors will also be emphasized as practitioners learn to provoke, relate, reveal, and ultimately connect others to important natural, cultural, and historical resources.
