Applicants are strongly encouraged to take courses not only within their own reference group but to also consider those groups with whom they are much less familiar. Such upper division courses are typically offered by, but not limited to, Anthropology, Armenian Studies, Asian American Studies, Chicano, and Latin American Studies, Criminology, Africana and American-Indian Studies, Gerontology, Psychology, Sociology and Women's Studies.
