Position Summary:

The Chemistry department invites applications for lecturer positions for up to 15 credit hours per semester (full time). Primary teaching assignments will be in General Chemistry and service courses for non-majors. Qualified instructors may also be assigned upper-division lecture and laboratory courses as needed.

Overview:

The Department of Chemistry at California State University, Fresno offers an American Chemical Society recognized BS Chemistry degree, BS Biochemistry degree, a BA Chemistry degree designed for pre-health professional students, and a thesis based MS degree in Chemistry to approximately 340 undergraduate and 18 graduate students. The 15 full time faculty have a commitment to excellence in both teaching and research, and to the success of our students. Since 1996, when the Provost's Awards awards were established Chemistry Department faculty have received five awards in the areas of teaching, research, mentorship or innovation, and three Promising New Faculty awards. The Fresno State Chemistry Club is an active, engaged, and successful ACS student affiliate with six outstanding chapter, one commendable chapter, and three green chemistry awards in the last seven years. The Department is active in research and faculty and students have access to a wide variety of major instrumentation. Library resources to support research and classroom instruction include both SciFinder and Web of Science along with electronic access to a wide variety of major journals, including ACS and Elsevier subscriptions.

Required Education:

Candidate must have a Ph.D. degree from an accredited university in Chemistry, Biochemistry, or a related discipline; however, faculty nearing completion of the doctorate (ABD) may be considered.

Required Experience:

1) University-level teaching experience; 2) Ability to demonstrate a commitment to working effectively with faculty, staff, and students from diverse ethnic, cultural, and socioeconomic backgrounds.

Preferred Qualifications:

Evidence of teaching effectiveness, understanding of the teaching and learning process, and currency in the subject matter of teaching assignments.

Application Procedures:

Review of applications will begin December 2, 2015, and will continue until the position is filled. To apply, applicants must complete an on-line application at jobs.csufresno.edu and attach the following: 1) a cover letter specifically addressing required experience and preferred qualifications; 2) a curriculum vitae, and; 3) a list of at least three professional references. Finalists will be required to submit 1) three current letters of recommendation (dated within the last 12 months) and; 2) official transcripts. Other Requirements:
