The Earth & Space Sciences (E&SS) includes geology, geophysics, soil science, oceanography, astronomy, and atmospheric science. E&SS knowledge has a direct impact upon the welfare of every resident. There have been many recent examples in California, the US, and the Indian Ocean of the need for E&SS knowledge on the part of the general population.

Earth and Space Sciences: 1. provide a good background for biology, chemistry, and physics; 2. are exciting and inspiring; 3. are needed in California for daily life (e.g. landslide, earthquake, volcanic, flood, water, aggregate, energy, health, soil issues); 4. are good for disadvantaged students. In addition, California has two major space science facilities, JPL and NASA-Ames. The state has been and remains a major source of petroleum and other minerals.

Despite the growing general need for E&SS knowledge there is some reluctance to approve the E&SS as a 9-12 class that satisfies university admission requirements for laboratory science. Many academics perceive E&SS as being inferior to physics, chemistry, and biology. To win approval of E&SS as a laboratory science for university admission requires convincing both University faculty and administration of the desirability of such a move. A statewide mobilization of E&SS professionals and other interested people could help move this process along.
