- Earn a stipend for serving as a supplementary instructor, lab facilitator, tutor, or grader for mathematics courses.

Financial Benefits

- Receive approximately \$1000 per year for professional memberships, conference attendance, professional development activity participation, and books/supplies from the Mathematics and Science Teacher Initiative (MSTI).
- Guaranteed paid experience working with K-12 students through the Teaching Fellows Scholarship Program; students can earn \$700 per month.
- Eligibility for an annual Scholarship of \$1250 awarded in the spring semester of the freshman year and renewable up to three years through Kremen School of Education's Teaching Fellows Scholarship Program.
- Qualify for \$3750 per year through the Federal TEACH Grant Program.

Eligibility Criteria

- Interested in becoming a middle or high school mathematics teacher
- Minimum 3.5 high school GPA or 3.3 community college GPA
- Must have taken Calculus in high school and received a grade of C or better
