

# Fresno Math Circle

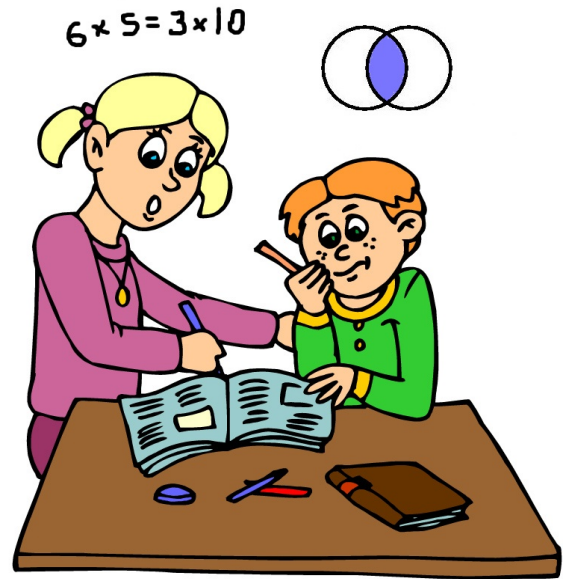
## grades 3-10

### What is Fresno Math Circle?

It is a junior math club for children interested in mathematics. This year we have three groups meeting on Saturday mornings: for students in grades 3-4, grades 5-6, and grades 7-10. (Grades 11-12 are meeting on Thursday nights, see a separate flyer for details.)

### Why?

The purpose of the Fresno Math Circle is to expand children's understanding of mathematical concepts by introducing challenging problems. Students will have an opportunity to develop logic and reasoning skills while having fun with mathematics!
