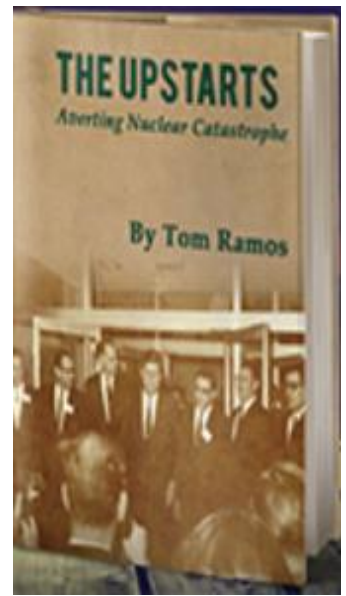


Keynote talk – 2017 SPS Zone 18 Meeting
