

Call for Nominations for 2023 Ethical Leadership Award

A combined project of the Fresno State Ethics Center and the Lyles Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship

Goal: To inspire a passion for stewardship and ethical leadership in Fresno State students

Criteria

- The awardee should have **substantial accomplishments of excellence** in ethical leadership, stewardship, entrepreneurial innovation, and community engagement. The awardee need not be at the end of his/her career.
- The awardee should have **some tangible connection with Fresno, Fresno State, and the Central Valley, and the experience of diverse students at Fresno State**. The awardee need not be a Fresno State Alum or a resident of the Central Valley.
- The awardee should have a demonstrated ability to communicate a vision of ethics, leadership, and stewardship and be able to **inspire and support our diverse students in concrete ways**.

The awardee will be asked to provide a lecture to students and will be honored at a "Celebration of Ethics" event co-sponsored with the Better Business Bureau.
