



Your first decision when enrolling is whether to choose a 401(k) plan, a 457(b) plan, or both — and whether you want to pay taxes now or later. Within the plans, you have a choice between:

Pre-tax — You'll be taxed when you take a distribution

**Roth** — Your contributions are taxed before they enter your account; you may be able to take tax-free distributions if certain criteria are met

<sup>2</sup> Withdrawals may be subject to ordinary income tax. Withdrawals made prior to age 59½ may incur a 10% early withdrawal tax. Eligibility criteria to withdraw funds are featured in the 401(k) Hardship Withdrawal Booklet in the Forms/Publications/Governing Documents & Reports section of <u>savingsplusnow.com</u>.

<sup>3</sup> One outstanding loan per plan is allowed, not to exceed two outstanding loans across both the 401(k) and 457(b) plans. You may qualify for a loan based on your account value.
