

Professor for Applied Research



-Full-time position with excellent benefits.

-Twelve-month, full-time, tenure-track position in the areas of Viticulture and Enology.

This is a partially funded grant position.

-Responsibilities: The successful candidate will develop a viticulture and enology applied research program serving the wine and winegrape industry in Oklahoma. The individual will work with the various grower groups to schedule and fund research that addresses long and short-term needs of the industry. The position will work closely with other faculty at Redlands and other Oklahoma institutions of higher education to deliver workshops designed to improve the skill level in wineries and vineyards. The faculty member is expected to serve as State Coordinator for our National Science Foundation grant and work to secure additional research funding from multiple sources and to publish research results when appropriate. Undergraduate teaching in research methodology, viticulture and enology is expected.

-Qualifications: The successful candidate must have a Master's Degree in viticulture and/or enology and must have training and/or experience in applied research. Prior experience in working with the grower and vintner groups is highly desirable. Effective oral and written communications skills are required. Graduate students expecting a Spring 2014 completion may apply.

-To apply: Submit a cover letter, resume, copies of college transcripts, and three references with names, addresses, and phone numbers. Candidate screening will begin immediately, but applications will be accepted until the position is filled.
