## FAQ's

**Q: Is this mandatory?**

A: Highly recommend but not required.

**Q: I am planning on going to my district's co-teaching workshop, do I have to attend the Fresno State workshop, too?**

A: No.

**Q: My master teacher (or student teacher) cannot attend, can I attend alone?**

A: The workshop works if both co-teachers attend together. We do not recommend coming alone. The workshop is designed to work in pairs.

**Q: I have two master teachers (or student teachers), can I attend the workshop with both of them?**

A: Yes!

**Q: How does the district get reimbursed for the substitute teacher?**

A: The district will send the Field Placements office an invoice for the cost of the substitute.

**Q: I have already attended a Fresno State co-teaching workshop with a different co-teacher. Is this workshop going to be different?**

A: Yes! Some review can be helpful in reinforcing co-teaching strategies. The pairs/group dynamic activities will also make this a different experience since you will be working with a different co-teacher than in the past.

**Q: What role does the university supervisor play in the workshop?**

A: The university supervisor is there to support both the master teacher and student teacher.

**Q: I am an intern, can I attend?**

A: Yes! You may bring your mentor. This has been very beneficial for interns. Please attend and we will pay for your substitute if you miss a school day.

**Note for Cooperating Teachers:** Please follow the regular process of requesting a substitute at your school for the date you attend the workshop. Let your school site know that you are attending a "Co-Teaching Workshop" held by Fresno State (they might have a code already set up for the event). Your school will send over the invoice to our office and we will reimburse the district/school for the substitute if you attend the workshop.
