In addition, the Lowell Neighborhood Association and some of their partners worked with Fresno State faculty and students from disciplines across the university. The service projects were developed and implemented by Fresno State students with support and supervision from their instructors. Collectively, Fresno State students and faculty provided a number of services that supported the revitalization of the neighborhood, one of the poorest in a city identified as having the highest concentration of poverty in the nation.
