PAY IT FORWARD





Now that AI is becoming more and more relevant in every industry, learning about AI can significantly improve your future career opportunities!

The certificate requires a total of 15 units:

- IS 51 Programming Fundamentals (Python) Units: 3
- IS 130 Information Systems Units: 3
- IS 160 Artificial Intelligence in Business Units: 3
- IS 170 Machine Learning Applications Units: 3
- One dept elective Units: 3




In these courses, you will learn hands-on how to code in Python and the different types of algorithms used in artificial intelligence.
