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Introduction

This year's Data Book includes several new tables. Each year, I review the previous year's Data Book for needed refinements. New additions to this campus resource are based on feedback I receive from the university community. Further, I take into account common data requests made to IRAP and my knowledge of university issues and goals that could be supported or tracked using existing but unpublished data. The new data tables are noted below, as are a few prominent patterns and trends that are evident in this year's book.

New Data Tables

Increasing the first-year student retention rate and six-year graduation rate are goals in Fresno State's Strategic and Academic Plans. As the Student Success Task Force discussed the university's efforts to achieve these goals, the paucity of data on transfer students relative to that of new freshmen became evident. To remedy this, we added new tables on transfer student preparation ([Tables 20-23](#)) and transfer student graduation rates ([Tables 90-95](#)).

IRAP receives many requests for more detailed race/ethnicity data than the standard five categories. To respond to this need, we included a table called Headcount by Race with Asian and Hispanic Ethnicities ([Table 44](#)). This is the finest level of data the CSU collects. Unfortunately, it does not include a Hmong category, the group about which we get the most requests.

Another frequent request, especially from businesses, is for data about where our students come from. Therefore, we added a table called "California Resident Enrollment by County" ([Table 49](#)) and another called "Top 20 Feeder Schools" ([Table 56](#)) which shows the primary high schools and community colleges Fresno State students attended before enrolling here.

Two tables, Headcount by College, Department and Gender ([Table 39](#)) and Degrees Awarded by Gender ([Tables 65 and 66](#)), were added because they existed in prior Data Books by race/ethnicity but not by gender and we occasionally receive requests for this data.

Another noticeable lack is data on classes offered, yet this information is critical for planning and budgeting. Additionally, it may help show the extent to which some of the Academic Plan's curricular goals, such as more active learning pedagogies and incorporating technology into instruction, are being achieved. Therefore, we added a new section with tables showing the number of classes by size, type, and online format by college. Over time, this section will expand as needed.

Goals and Trends

Enrollment continues to climb ([Tables 25 and 27](#)) as we consistently meet the targets the CSU system establishes. Growth is across the board; new first-time freshmen, new transfers and new graduate students. Most new transfer students enter as juniors ([Tables 20 and 21](#)). In general, the percentage of new upper division transfers has grown since academic year 2003-04; they're joining us after accumulating more credit units. Increasing the percentage of graduate students is one of the goals of the university's Academic Plan. Scholarships and financial support for recruitment are part of the Graduate Augmentation Plan designed to achieve this goal. In Fall 2006, graduate enrollment surged ([Table 25](#)). It increased again, at a lesser rate, in Fall 2007. However, these initiatives were not yet in place in Fall 2006. They were implemented beginning Spring 2007. Graduate Studies and IRAP are working together to evaluate the effect of the Graduate Augmentation Plan initiatives.

Toward the goal of improving first-year student retention rates, we're not doing so well. After a steady rise, first-year retention rates for new freshmen peaked with the Fall 2004 cohort and declined for subsequent cohorts ([Table 70](#)). This Fall, President Welty formed the Retention Oversight Group to examine this trend and produce a report with recommendations at the end of this academic year.

Mirroring the national trend, Hispanic enrollment continues to increase ([Table 41](#)). International students and the Other/Unknown category are the only race/ethnicity categories to show a numerical decline across five years. The Other/Unknown decline may simply be due to more students choosing to identify a racial/ethnic category. As for international students, across the U.S. their enrollment dropped after the 9/11 terrorist attacks in 2001. Our international student enrollment has not rebounded. The largest numbers of international students at Fresno State are from India and Japan ([Table 46](#)). The number of Indian students is increasing and they are primarily graduate students while the number of Japanese students, who are primarily undergraduates, is declining ([Table 47](#)).

This Fall we published and disseminated the First Generation Stories booklet and website which showcases the educational journeys of Fresno State faculty, staff and administrators who were the first in their family to earn a Bachelor's degree. A large portion of Fresno State students are first-generation. Nationally, first-generation students drop out of college at substantially higher rates than their peers whose parents were college graduates. The stories publication, intended as a means of encouraging and supporting potential students and first-generation students on our campus, now has a slightly larger portion of the student body to reach than when the project was conceived. The percentage of first-generation students grew from 65% of new students in Fall 2005 to 67% in Fall 2007 ([Table 53](#)).

The Diversity Task Force concluded its work this Fall with recommendations that the university recruit and retain a diverse faculty and staff. The gender and racial/ethnic distribution of employees has remained fairly constant over the last five years ([Tables 97 and 100](#)). Some change is evident though. The percentage of women as managers increased from 42% to 46% ([Table 101](#)). The number and percentage of full-time faculty who are Asian increased and the percentage of full-time White faculty declined ([Table 110](#)).

GLOSSARY

Cohort –

A group of students who entered the university during the same semester.

Continuing Undergraduate –

An undergraduate student who had units attempted at this campus during the prior term of the regular sessions.

Dependent Family Income –

Gross annual income of students' parents for the year as reported by dependent applicants on the CSU application for admission. An applicant is considered dependent if none of the following apply: a) is 24 years or older, b) is a graduate student, c) is married or has dependents, d) is an orphan/ward of the court, or e) is a veteran of the U.S. armed services.

First-Time Freshman –

A student who has earned college credit not later than the end of the summer immediately following high school graduation or a student who has not earned any college credit.

First-Year Retention Rate –

The percentage of a new student cohort entering the university during a Fall semester that was enrolled in the next Fall semester

FTES –

The theoretical workload needed to complete a 120 semester unit baccalaureate program in four academic years. This workload is equal to 15 semester credit units per term (15 SCU=1 FTES). This is the unit on which the university's funding is based. As of Fall 2005, FTES for graduate students admitted into a program is calculated using 12 units instead of 15 (12 SCU=1 FTES).

Graduate Student –

Includes only students who have been admitted to a graduate program. This category does not include all postbaccalaureate students.

Graduation Rate –

The percentage of students who entered the university during a particular Fall semester and graduated within a specified time period.

Headcount Enrollment –

This is a unique count of students and reflects the number of individual students on campus.

Independent Family Income –

Gross annual income reported by independent applicants on the CSU application for admission. See "Dependent Income" above for criteria for independence.

Postbaccalaureate Student –

Includes all students who have already earned a baccalaureate degree, including students who are pursuing a second baccalaureate.

Returning Student –

A former student returning after an absence of one or more terms who has no units attempted elsewhere during the absence from the campus.

Returning Transfer –

A former student returning after an absence of one or more terms who has units attempted elsewhere since the previous enrollment at this university.

Stop Out –

A student who stopped attending the university for one or more terms and then returned.

Transitory Undergraduate –

A student who is admitted under special procedures but who has continuing status at another institution.

Undergraduate Transfer Student –

A new student who is not a first-time freshman and who does not hold a baccalaureate degree from any college.

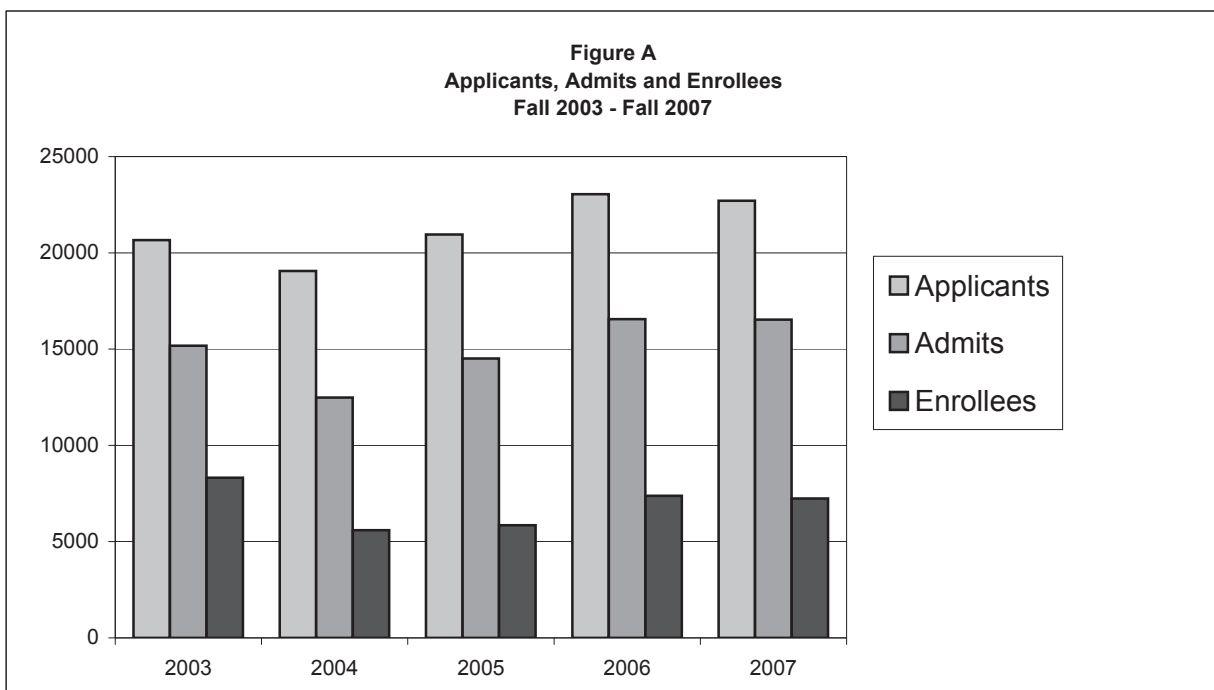

Fall 2003 - Fall 2007**

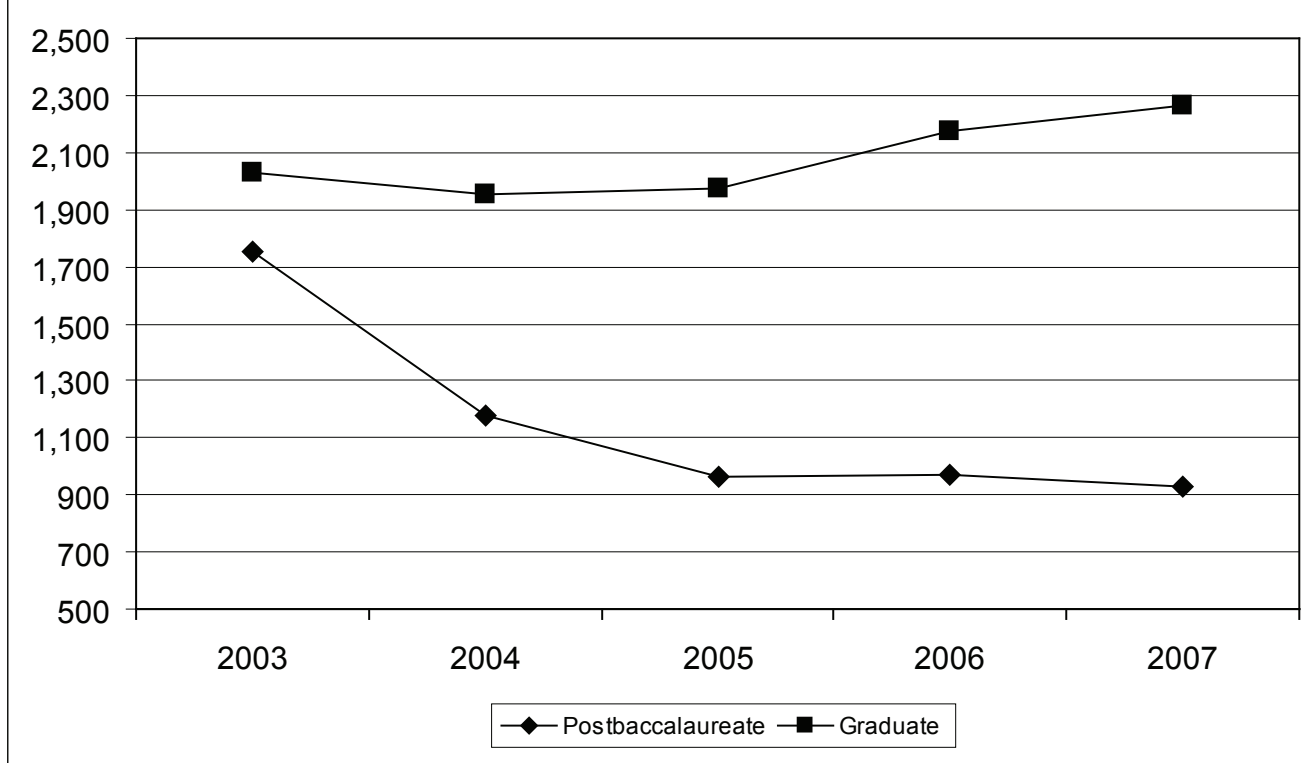

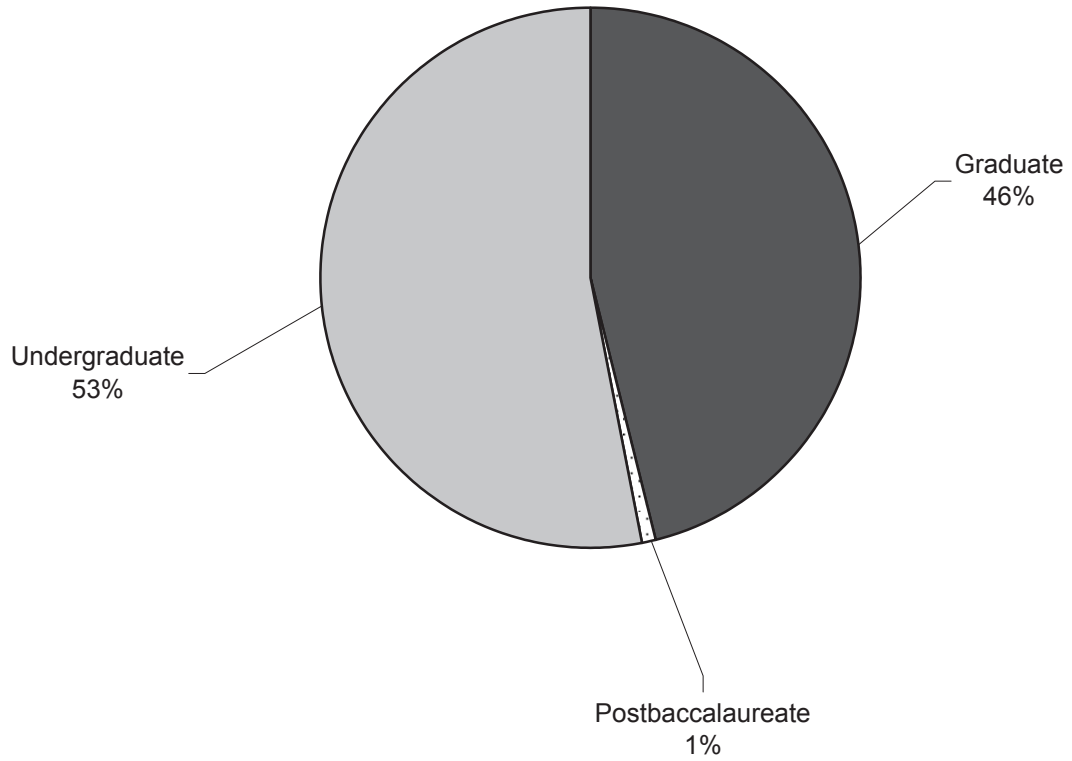

Fall 2007**

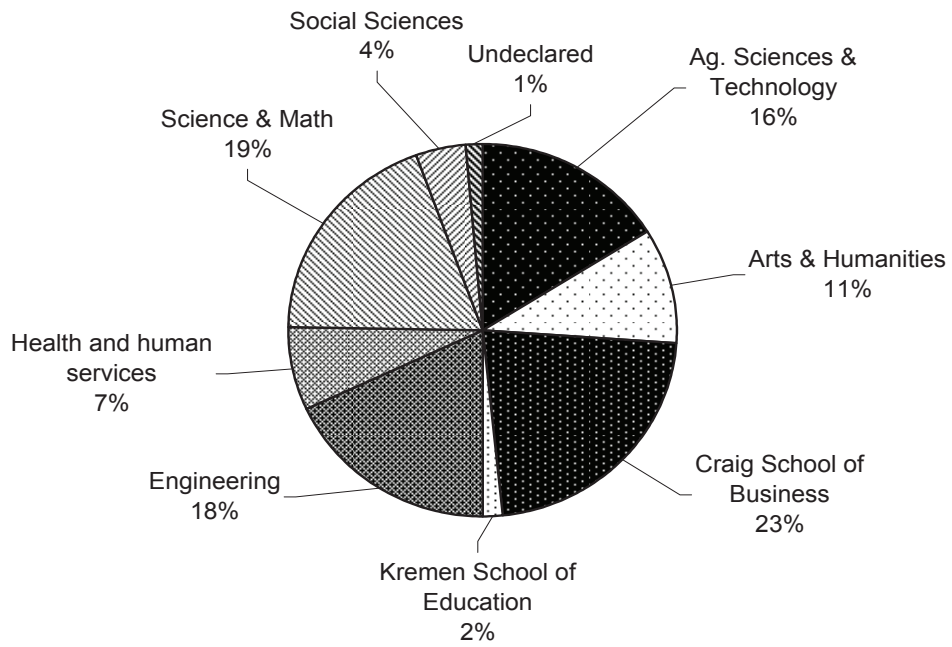
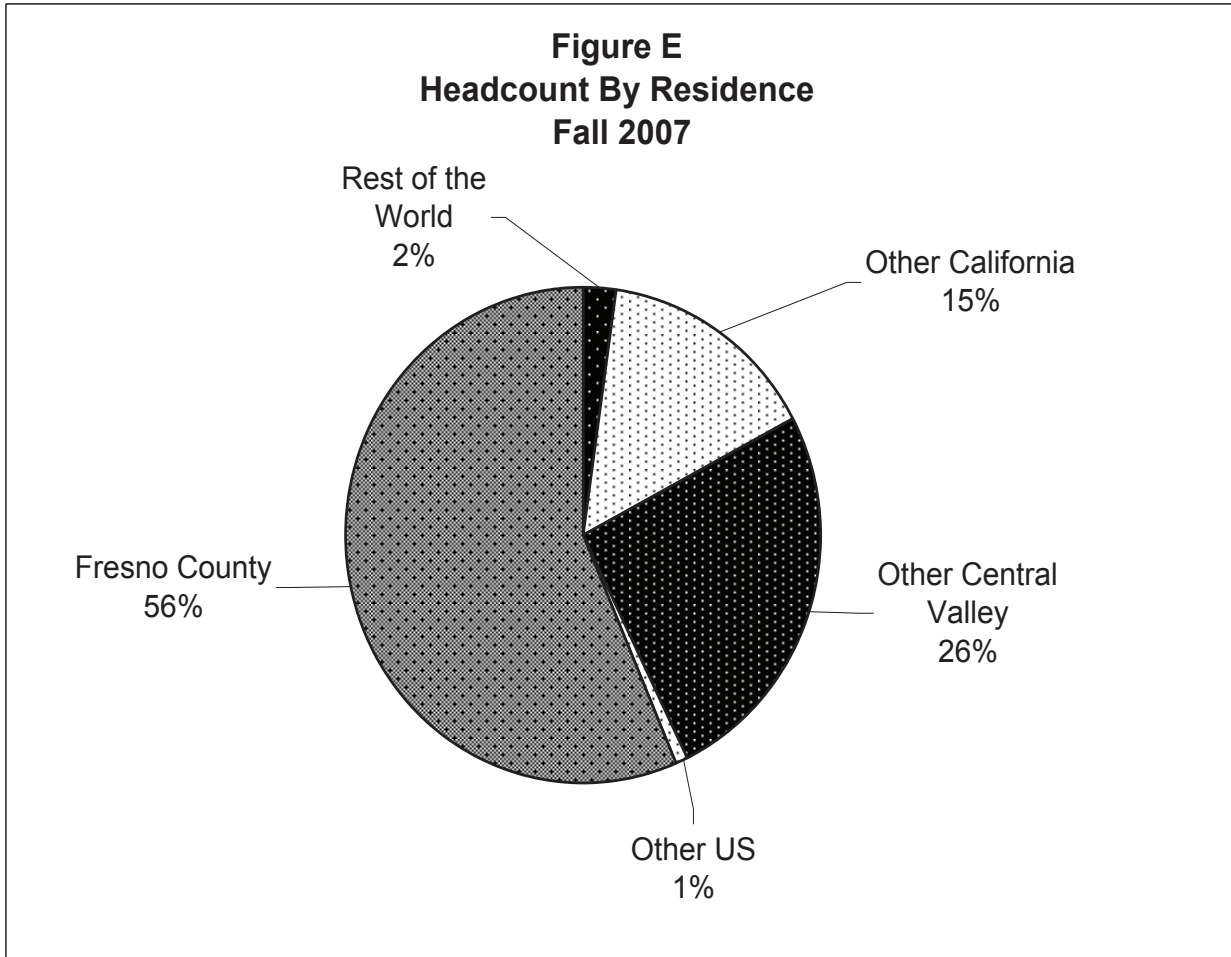

Academic Years 2002-03 to 2006-07

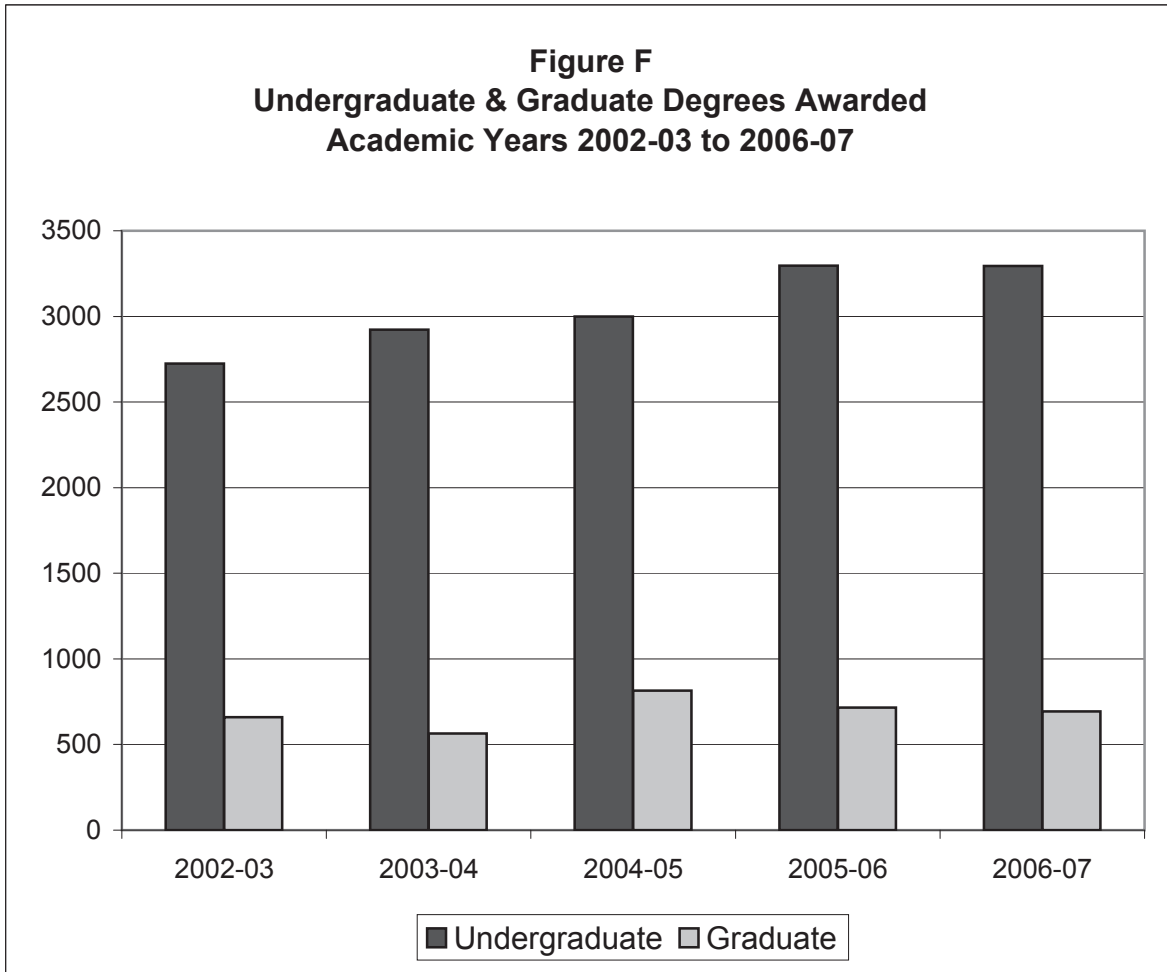

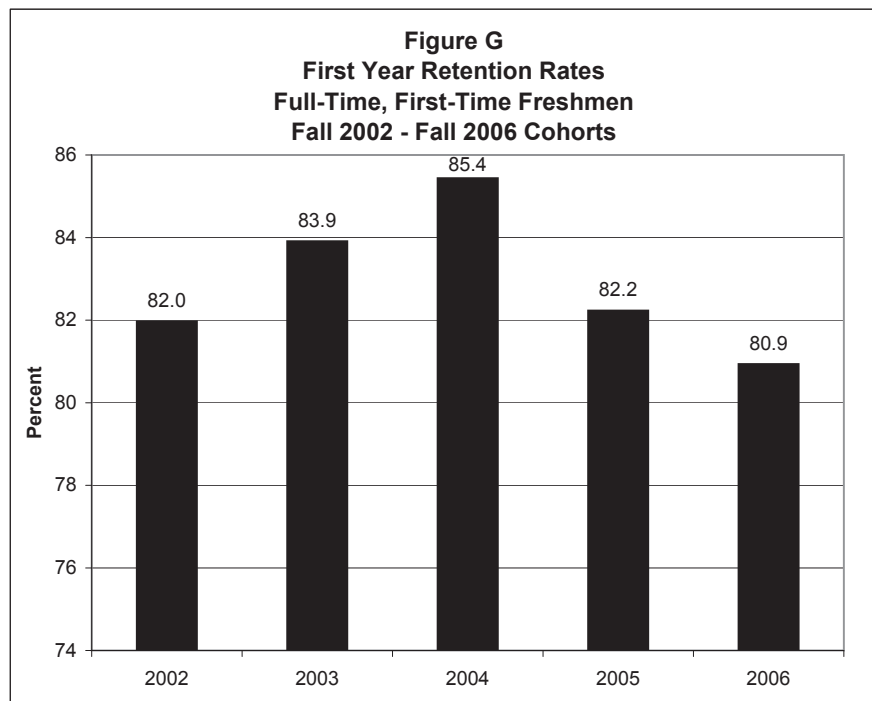

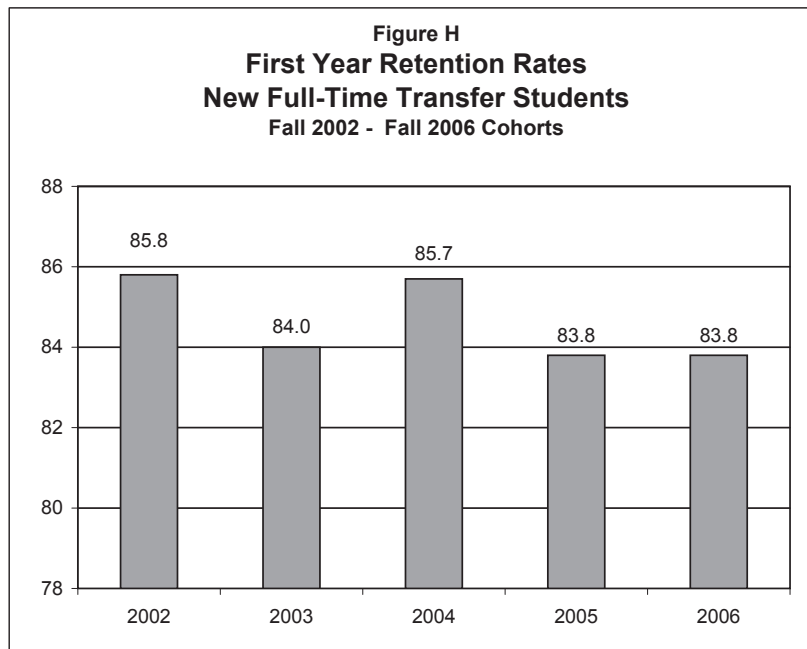
