

Students are increasingly traditional in terms of attendance pattern but nontraditional in racial/ethnic background

- They are more likely to attend full-time (72% vs. 84%)
- New undergraduates are more likely to enter as freshmen than as transfer students (56% vs. 43%)
- Students are slightly younger (Y2000 median age 23 vs. 22), undergraduates (22.0 vs. 21.1), graduate/pbacc (30.1 vs. 27.1)



· Shifts in racial/ethnic background

- Increase: Asian (7% vs. 15%), Hispanic (17% vs. 36%), African American (3.7% vs. 5%)
- Decline: White (59% vs. 33%), Native American (1.3% vs.0.6%), International (4% to 2%)



Remediation*


- Decrease in Math remediation rates (Y2000 58% vs. Y2010 49%)
- Increase in English remediation rates (Y2000 56% vs. Y2010 63%)

More local and more undergraduate

- Students are more likely to be local overall (66% vs. 73%)
- Smaller percentage of postbaccalaureate students (20% vs. 15%)
