



Pandemic Pods

Sheltering in place, while safe, can be monotonous and lonely. We miss the social interactions with friends, family and OLLI.

The Greater Good Science Center explored the subject of Pandemic Pods, "as an effective way to get our social, emotional, and familial needs met without unnecessarily endangering ourselves or others. Pods are small, self-contained networks of people who limit their non-distanced social interaction to one another—in other words, they're the small group of people with whom you share air without using breath-control precautions such as masks.

"Pods (or "bubbles" or "containers" or "quaranteams") aren't just ways for people to have social connection within a pandemic. They also serve an important epidemiological purpose—they help limit the size and spread of outbreaks."
