5. Limit of enrollments of 25 students in "W" courses; following Academic Policy Manual.

The 25-student limit for W courses is noted in the APM, p. 216. Course enrollments have increased in a number of writing-intensive courses, due to our obligation, as noted by D. Nef, that we must serve students who were admitted to campus for f2009, before the university was certain of its budget situation. As a temporary solution, D. Nef believes that the 25-person limit may be exceeded (according to "C4 guidelines" noted in the APM (p. 216)), for the spring 2010 semester, but that the excess number of students should be close to 25, and that faculty who are asked to teach courses in which these limits are exceeded should be provided support where possible (e.g. in the form of Teaching Assistants to assist grading of papers) and in proportion to the excess of students. V. Crisco affirmed there is a decrease in quality of writing samples as enrollments increase, as indicated by research, and Nef agreed that in fall 2010, the university should be in a better position to adhere to the 25-student

limit, as enrollment numbers of new students will better reflect the university's ability to offer W courses without eroding quality.
