ADVISING NOTES

- Lower-division courses should be taken before upper-division courses.
- Upper-division requirements should be taken prior to upper-division electives.
- No General Education Integration or Multicultural/International course offered by the Department of Criminology may be used to satisfy the General Education requirements for Criminology majors.
- CR/NC grading is not permitted in the major, with the exceptions of CRIM 1, 108, 180, 181, and 182.
- General Education and elective units may be used toward a dual major or minor (see *Dual Major* or departmental minor). Consult the appropriate department chairperson.
- Students who wish to be considered for the Criminology Honors Program are advised not to take CRIM 100 or CRIM 170 prior to application to the Honors Program, as there are honors versions of these courses. FOOTNOTES

1. These courses are required for all four Options in the Criminology major.
2. Because of its importance for all Criminology majors, CRIM 1 should be taken as early as possible. Freshmen and transfer students majoring in Criminology are expected to take CRIM 1 no later than their second semester. CRIM 1 is a prerequisite for CRIM 180, 181, and 182.
3. CRIM 2 is a prerequisite for CRIM 113, 114, 154, 156, 157, and 159T.
4. Completion of G.E. Foundation and Breadth requirements are prerequisites to enrolling in this Upper-division G.E. (Integration) course.
5. CRIM 50 should be taken before CRIM 170. The CRIM 50 requirement may also be met by completing PSYCH 42, PH 92, MATH 11, DS 73, or any equivalent statistics course from another university or community college.
6. There are no substitute courses for CRIM 154. On occasion a substitute course for CRIM 155 *may* be available (e.g., from the Biology or Psychology Department) and must be pre-approved by the FBS Option Coordinator as a satisfactory substitute. Students need to plan their course schedules with this in mind.
7. CRIM 170 should be taken during the junior year. While PSYCH 144 can be used to substitute for CRIM 170, note that it is a 5-unit course and has PSYCH 10 and PSYCH 42 as prerequisites.
8. FBS students must choose either PSYCH 120T (Forensic Cognitive Science) or PSYCH 128 (Cognitive Science) as one of their Upper-division Requirements. When they choose one of these courses as an Upper-division Requirement, they may choose the other as their Psychology Electives Cluster course. Students cannot double-count either one of these courses as both an Upper-division Requirement and a Psychology Elective.
9. Priority for this course is given to FBS Option students. Non-FBS Option students require permission of the instructor.
10. FBS students may apply a maximum of 3 units of credit for CRIM 136T (Mock Trial) toward General Electives Cluster requirements. Two different 136T courses would be acceptable for 6 General Elective Cluster units.
11. FBS students may apply a maximum of 3 units of credit for any combination of CRIM 108, 180, 181, or 182 toward General Elective Cluster requirements.
12. FBS students must take CRIM 114 as a prerequisite or co-requisite for CRIM 180, 181, and 182.
13. PSYCH 160T, depending upon the topic, has a variable number of units (2 to 5 units). To qualify as an acceptable Psychology Elective Cluster course for FBS, the course must be worth a minimum of 4 units.
