

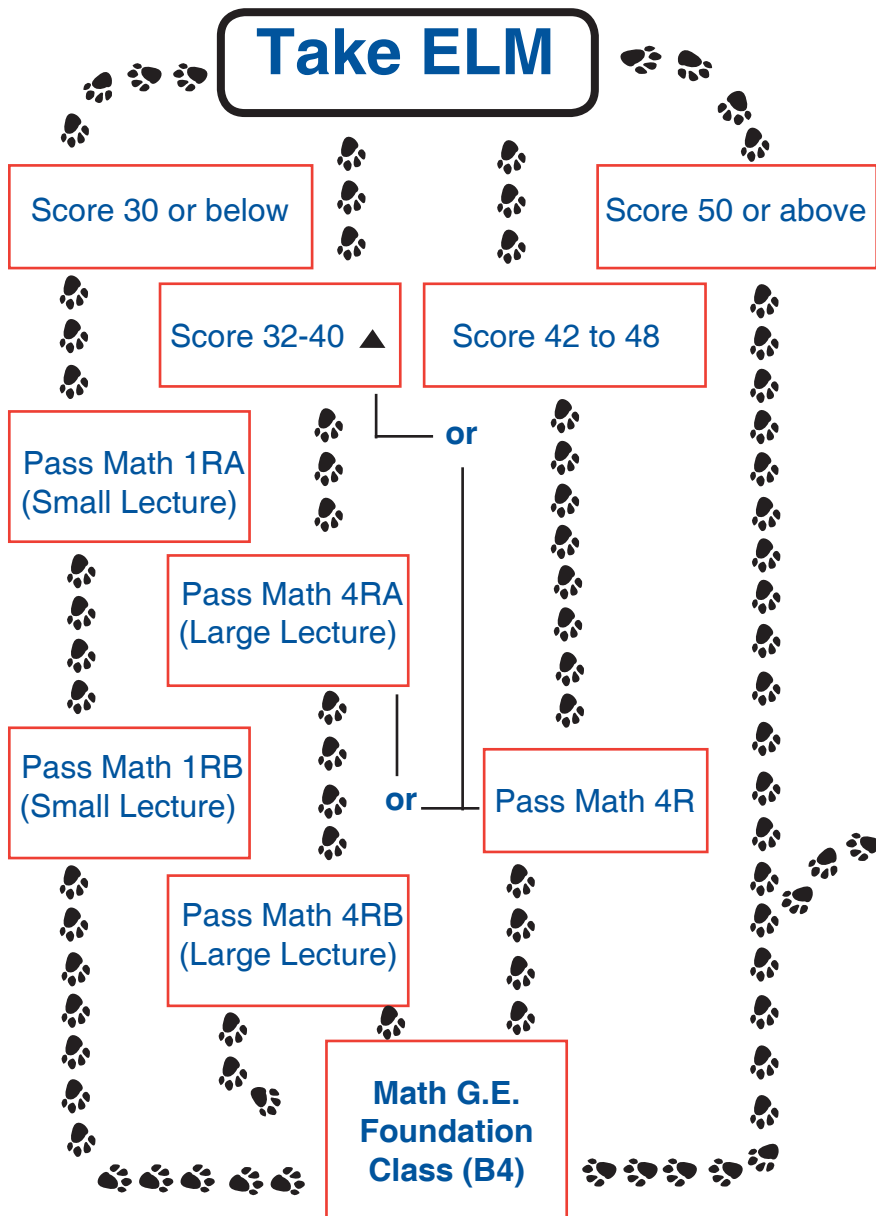


Executive order 665 requires that if you are not exempt from the ELM and do not pass the ELM, you must enroll in the appropriate remedial mathematics course(s) during the first year you attend Fresno State.

ENTRY LEVEL MATHEMATICS (ELM) EXAM

A passing score for the ELM is defined as a minimum score of 50. *The ELM may be taken more than one time, but remediation deadlines do not change.*

If you score less than 50, you must successfully complete Math 4R before taking the General Education Quantitative Reasoning (B4) requirement.



▲ Students who score 32 to 40 on the ELM are **very strongly advised** to enroll in the two-semester Math 4RA/B large lecture (rather than Math 4R).

ELM Exemptions

- Placement in the “unconditionally exempt” category on the Early Assessment of Readiness for College Mathematics taken in conjunction with the 11th grade California Standards Test in High School Math or Algebra II
- Placement in the “conditionally exempt” category on the Early Assessment of Readiness for College Mathematics taken in conjunction with the 11th grade California Standards Test in High School Mathematics or Algebra II, **AND** successful completion of a CSU-approved math or math-related course or activity taken before enrolling at a CSU campus
- A score of 550 or above on the mathematics section of the SAT I
- A score of 550 or above on Level I, IC, II, or IIC of the College Board Mathematics Achievement Test or SAT II: Mathematics Test
- A score of 23 or above on the ACT

Additional Exemptions Advanced Placement

- A score of 3 or above on the AP Calculus AB or Calculus BC satisfies both the ELM requirement and G.E. (B4)
- A score of 3 or above on the AP Statistics exam satisfies the ELM requirement only
