REGISTERING FOR CLASSES

You will register for your classes at Fresno State in one of two ways:

- through the self-service options available via the web: http://my.csufresno.edu
- using the touchtone telephone method

All registration fees must be paid by the specified deadline. If fees are not received by this date, your classes are subject to cancellation.

Review the *Class Schedule* for directions and tips, and pay close attention to the instructions you receive.

As you prepare to register for classes, be aware of the following:

- You should know your student ID (KeyCard) number.
- Check registration holds by using the "My Fresno State" portal: http://my.csufresno.edu.
- The maximum number of units you can register for is 18. However, it is generally recommended that students enroll in 12 to 15 units.
- The system may restrict registration in certain classes based on major and/or class level.
