

# NASA Aerospace Academy

Fresno State is one of nine institutions nationwide, funded by NASA, to implement an Aerospace Academy. A major purpose of the Academy is to increase interest and involvement of K-12 students in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. The program offers 36 hours of STEM engagement, using NASA-themed, problem based curriculum. The family involvement component include family nights and take-home projects to promote collaboration between students and family members.

## Youth Technology Institute

The Youth Technology Institute (YTI), a program operated and managed under the Fresno State NASA Aerospace Academy, is taught using the latest technology, software, and equipment. Learners will participate in two 90-minute classes each day.

Each class is limited to 20 students to maximize individual attention and to allow adequate time for practice. Learners will develop skills in technology as they explore and problem solve with hands-on activities.

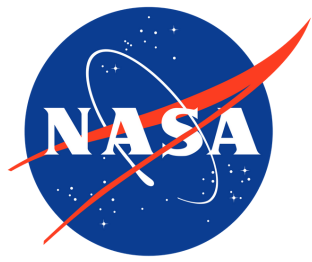
