 - 2. Many Dream students continue to have challenges in meeting residency documentation requirements. Fresno State Admissions continues to require permanent residency cards, employment authorization card, and social security card from Dream students even when AB 540 law does not require them. This has caused delays.
 - a. As of June 16, 70 active incoming students have not cleared residency

 - b. Have not been able to launch a DOC Website
 - 4. Fresno State Materials. We have very little Fresno State materials/promotional items to hand out during information tables and/or presentations
