

Below is information and instructions for whom to include in the household, as well as for the "College Name" field.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR HOUSEHOLD SIZE

NOTE: Consistent with the Supreme Court decision on the Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA), same-sex couples must report their marital status as married **if they were legally married** in a state or other jurisdiction (foreign country) that permits same-sex marriage (people in a civil union or domestic partnership are not considered "married" for student aid purposes).

Who do you list in the household?

List the people in your household, including:

- yourself, (the student)
- your spouse, (as listed on the FAFSA)
- your children **IF**
 - ⇒ You (or your spouse) will provide more than half of their support from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015 **OR**
 - ⇒ the children would be required to provide parental information when completing a 2014-2015 FAFSA
- other people if they live with you now for who **you (or your spouse) currently provide and will continue to provide more than 50% of their support** from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015.

Do not include the following:

- Foster children
- Any child you (or your spouse) are paying child support for

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING "ATTENDING COLLEGE"

On your FAFSA application, you were asked to identify the number of people attending college for the 2014-2015 aid year. The number in college should include any household member who:

- Will be enrolled at least half-time at an eligible post-secondary education institution
- At any time between July 1, 2014 and June 30, 2015
- In a degree, diploma, or certificate program

For each person who meets the above criteria, indicate the name of the college. **If the college the person is attending is Fresno State, be sure to also include that person's Fresno State Student ID number.**

PLEASE NOTE: We may require additional documentation if we have reason to believe that the information regarding the household members enrolled in eligible post-secondary educational institutions is inaccurate.
