

Financial Aid Proration Information

- Initial financial aid awards are based upon the expectation of full time enrollment (12 units or more). All financial aid recipients will have their eligibility recalculated based on their enrollment at census date (the end of a term's fourth week of instruction).
 - Direct loans do not automatically disburse to students enrolled in less than 12 units. Please contact the Financial Aid Office if you will not be enrolling in at least 12 units for the term.
- If you drop units, withdraw, or fail to attend class, you must contact the Financial Aid Office at **(559) 278-2182**.

NOTE: Dropping units after receiving disbursement(s) may require you to repay some or all of the aid you received based upon your eligibility recalculation.

- Disbursements for most programs are prorated based on your actual enrollment at the time of the disbursement.
 - If you receive less than 100% of your award for the term, and then increase your enrollment, any increase will be done automatically.
- The amount disbursed is a percentage of the amount awarded to you based on the following table:

- If this disbursement includes Teach Grant, Perkins, Nursing, or Federal Direct Loan Funds and you wish to cancel all or a portion of these funds you must provide the Financial Aid Office with a cancellation request no later than 14 days from the date of the disbursement.
- Students in the Teacher Credential program will have their Federal Pell Grant and Cal Grants disbursed after census date, once enrollment in eligible courses is verified.
