## Resident Supervisor

<b>Program Summary:</b>	Upward Bound (UB) is a federally funded program designed to provide academic services to first-generation and/or low-income college bound high school students. UB provides students with the necessary support and assistance to persist in high school and encourage and motivate them to enroll into a post-secondary institution. During the summer, UB provides students with academic and career classes and gives them an opportunity to enhance their academic skills and improve in deficiencies.

<b>Essential Job Functions:</b>	Under the supervision of the Resident Supervisor and UB staff, the incumbent will be responsible for the following duties: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Supervise Resident Advisors (RAs) and high school students</li> <li>• Develop various activities for RAs and students while residing in dorms</li> <li>• Implement daily staff meetings with RA staff and meet with UB staff to provide updates, plan afternoon activities.</li> <li>• Assist UB staff in the development of UB activities, trips, and events (recreational, academic, and cultural).</li> <li>• Be responsible for ensuring student's safety, discipline, and policy procedures amongst residential staff and students.</li> <li>• Implement and supervise all activities and events that take place during the evening hours</li> <li>• On call for 24 hours during the duration of the program</li> <li>• Keep inventory of equipment, sign in sheets, meals, etc.</li> <li>• Able to collaborate and follow instruction as delegated by UB staff</li> <li>• Ability to enforce dorm rules, carry out disciplinary procedures, and report situations that UB staff must be aware of</li> <li>• Ability to develop and assist in the development of engaging and purposeful evening activities</li> </ul>
