Freshmen

Requirements for Freshmen Students:

- 🐾 Earn a high school diploma or equivalent
- 🐾 Complete the minimum A-G subject requirements with a letter grade C- or better in each course. The CSU will accept grades of "Credit" or "Pass" to satisfy "a-g" requirements completed during winter, spring or summer 2021 terms.
- 🐾 California residents and graduates of California high schools may be eligible for admission by earning a 2.50 or greater "a-g" GPA.

Spring Checklist

- ☐ Register and pay for ***Dog Days**, the mandatory new student orientation: **March 15 - May 1**
- ☐ Attend Dog Days in June/July
- ☐ Submit official high school and college transcripts by June 30

Transfer

Requirements for Upper-Division Transfer Students:

- 🐾 60 or more transferable semester units (90 quarter units)
- 🐾 Foundation courses (Areas A1, A2, A3, and B4) with a grade of C- or better
- 🐾 Meet the minimum cumulative GPA for the major a student chooses
- 🐾 Meet the minimum of 30 semester units (45 quarter units) of CSU General Education
- 🐾 Must be in "good standing" at the last college attended. Good standing means student is eligible to re-enroll at that institution

Fall Checklist

- ☐ Meet with Transfer Counselor or Fresno State Recruitment Counselor
- ☐ Apply to Fresno State **October 1- November 30**
- ☐ Create your Fresno State email account once you receive your Letter of Acknowledgment
- ☐ Check your admission status at my.fresnostate.edu

Spring Checklist

- ☐ Submit official transcripts with Fall grades and Spring in-progress coursework by **February 1**
- ☐ Check your admission status at my.fresnostate.edu
- ☐ Attend Preview Day
- ☐ Accept your admission to Fresno State: **March 15 - June 1**
- ☐ Register and pay for ***Dog Days**, the mandatory new student orientation by **June 1**
- ☐ Send final transcripts by June 30
- ☐ Attend Dog Days in July

Returning Students

- ☐ Apply to Fresno State **October 1 - January 15**
- ☐ Check your admission status at my.fresnostate.edu
- ☐ Submit all admissions documents (Residency, readmission petition, if needed, and transcript) by **February 1**
- ☐ Registration begins mid-April (No Dog Days Orientation required)
- ☐ Submit final transcripts by **June 30**

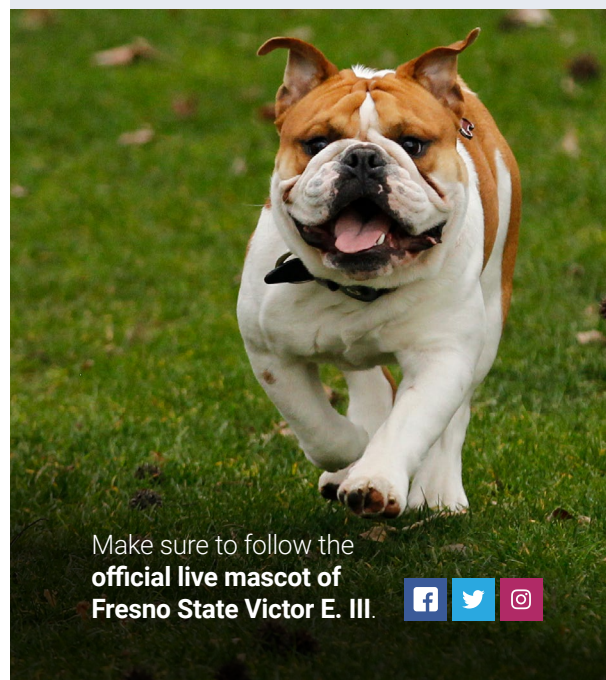
