



The Switch Energy Project's goal is to foster a practical discussion on the energy issues that drive our world. One way to extend this discussion on your campus, is to set up a panel discussion or Q&A session following the film. This gives people a chance to delve deeper into the issues, ask questions and discuss their thoughts and ideas with others who are passionate about energy.

When planning your post-screening discussion, there are a couple of different options to consider.

1. PANEL DISCUSSION *(Works well for large groups and auditorium/theatre settings)*

You can invite experts in the fields of energy and the environment to participate in a panel and answer audience questions.

Switch provides a balanced, informative perspective on energy, so it's important to make sure your panel reflects this as well. Make sure you have representatives from all sides of the spectrum: industry, environmental, academic, fossil and renewable. It helps to have a moderator of the panel to call on audience members with questions, keep track of time, etc.

2. GROUP DISCUSSION *(Works well for small groups, may not be possible in auditorium/theatre settings)*

Allow the audience to discuss the film together. Their thought, ideas and questions. This will require a facilitator to ensure that the conversation remains constructive.

3. Q&A SESSION *(Works well for large groups and auditorium/theatre settings)*

One expert will field questions from the audience after the screening. This could be a professor, or someone from the community. They should be knowledgeable and remain objective.

We can provide this person with a copy of the film ahead of the screening so that they are prepared to answer questions.
