Industry Reps Serve on Vineyard Evaluation Team

January 2012

In 2011, Dr. Jim Kennedy assembled a vineyard evaluation team comprised of industry representatives to assist in the development of a long-range strategic plan.

Kennedy was successful in identifying several industry members capable of this task, and on January 13, a meeting was held to review vineyard production figures, tour the vineyard and facilities, and identify areas that could improve the sustainability of the viticulture program. and wine industry, (raisin, table, and wine grape) were represented in these discussions.

cluded Kennedy, Mark Salwasser (vineyard manager), and the department's viticulture faculty members, Sanliang Gu, Kaan Kurtural, and Sonet van Zyl.

“It is important for us to continue to reach out to the industry we serve. We appreciate the team's perspective as we continue to evaluate how the university's vineyard meets our program's goals,” said Kennedy. Key findings will be incorporated into the long-term strategic vineyard plan, which will be developed by Kennedy and reviewed later this spring semester.

2012 Surveys: You Talk—We Listen!

According to Dr. Jim Kennedy, department chair, it is always good for programs to ask themselves how they can do a better job.

With that in mind, the Department of Viticulture and Enology will soon be distributing three different surveys to three specific audiences: 1) Employers—industry partners who have employed our graduates, 2) Employees—our graduates with industry experience, and 3) recent graduates of our program.

The surveys will provide valuable perspectives from employers in the real world and will also provide feedback on how well our experienced graduates are using their edu-

cation. To obtain impressions of the program from our recent graduates, Kennedy will initiate exit interviews in 2012 with each student as they graduate. All statistics and responses will be evaluated to determine identifiable gaps that need to be improved.

While it is recommended that formal surveys be conducted every four to five years, Kennedy encourages feedback in these areas on an ongoing basis.

“It is important to continually listen and learn from different perspectives. In this way, we can continue to strengthen our program.
