## **Background**

June English (1920-1987) spent much of her life researching the history of Fresno and Madera Counties and the Sierra Nevada. She was a researcher for the Fresno City and County Historical Society, a member of the Fresno Genealogical Society, and the historian for the Pineridge district of the Sierra National Forest. This is one of the collections that she compiled throughout her extensive career as a researcher.

## **Scope and Content Note**

The June English Local History collection measures 15 linear feet and dates from 1847 to 1991. The collection is arranged in seven series: Subject files, Surnames, Place names, Ethnic groups, Oral histories, Fresno County Census and Photographs. It has been left in its original order, as structured by June English. The books and pamphlets that she donated were incorporated into her organizational scheme.

The **Subject files** series (1847-1987 and undated) contains articles, newspaper clippings, pamphlets, research notes, books and other literature relating to the history of Fresno and Madera Counties and the Sierra Nevada. There is a broad range of subjects including agriculture, wildlife, clubs, recreation and transportation.

The **Surnames** series (1860-1987) focuses on the lives of early settlers of Fresno and Madera Counties and the Sierra Nevada. There is also information about the families of these early pioneers. This takes the form of newspaper clippings, diaries, books and pamphlets, as well as notes transcribed by June English.

The **Place names** series (1871-1890 and 1909-1985) contains newspaper clippings and other literature about the areas bordering the Sierra Nevada. This may include, but is not limited to, some background on the settlement of the area and where the names originated. There is a particular emphasis on Fresno City, Fresno County, Inyo/Mono Counties, and the Sierra Nevada.

The **Ethnic groups** series (1849-1851, 1871-1882 and 1917-1991) contains information outlining the history of numerous ethnic groups in Fresno and Madera Counties and the Sierra Nevada. There is a distinct emphasis on the history of Native Americans in this area, although various other ethnic groups are also represented. This series is largely comprised of newspaper clippings but also contains some pamphlets and journals, including the *California Indian Journal*.

The **Oral histories** series (1967-1987 and undated) mainly consists of cassette recordings (there is also one reel-to-reel recording) of oral interviews with descendants of those who originally settled in Fresno and Madera Counties.

**Scope and Content Note** (cont.)

The **Fresno County Census** series (1870-1880) contains microfilm copies of the 1870 and 1880 censuses conducted in Fresno County. The microfilm has been cut into pieces and arranged by page number. It can be read and printed on the microfilm readers housed in the Photocopy/Microforms Area.

The **Photographs** series (1858-1859 and 1880-1970) contains prints that portray everyday life in the Sierra Nevada in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. They consist of people, including individual portraits, family photos and group pictures, schools, houses, businesses, transportation, livestock and scenery, among other things. The photographs have been organized in the following subject categories: Forest views, Houses, Jackrabbit hunt, Logging, People, Places, Schools, and Transportation. Each photograph is listed by its identifying number within a category and includes names, dates and other relevant information, when available. An index with the photographs listed in numerical order is available at the end of the finding aid.
